Danish Ship Visit

Background

o April 14 Danish Parliament resolution called on government to inform visiting ships of Danish policy "not to accept nuclears" weapons in Danish territory, including ports."

- o U.S. and otheer allies reacted strongly, expressing concern over implications for NATO unity and for our NCND policy.
- o U.S. France, and UK postponed ship visits to Denmark, pending resolution of Danish policy on the issue.
- o Three weeks after May 10 election, conservative PM Schlueter formed a Conservative/Liberal/Radical Liberal coalition.
- o New government's defense program resolves ship visit issue without challenging NCND, provides a pro-NATO parlimentary majority, but promises zero real growth in defense budget.

New Danish Ship Visit Procedures

- o Annouced by Schlueter in Folketing on June 7, after consultation with U.S. and UK, includes:
 - -- Circulation of diplomatic note reiterating Danish anti-nuclear policies;
 - -- Attachment to note, for NATO countries, of DPC draft document describing Denmark's position in NATO;
 - -- Addition of following sentence to ship clearence letters: "The Danish Government assumes that the visit of the vessel is in compliance with rules laid down by the Danish Govenment"; and
 - -- Statement by Foreign Minister Ellemann-Jensen that new procedures respect NCND.

(U) Press Points: Danish Ship Visit Issue

- -- The U.S. "neither confirm for deny" policy applies globally; it is essential to our ability to carry out our NATO political and security commitments.
- -- The Danish handling of the ship visit issue does not infringe on NCND.
- -- The U.S. notes the statement of Foreign Minister Ellemann-Jensen that the new Danish policy respects NCND.
- -- Our NCND policy is essential to maintaining the operational flexibility of our Navy and the security of our forces.
